How:

- **Communicates effectively with** the campus community, parents, and others to build active involvement.
- **Selects** music that glorifies God when played in a sacred environment, and music that upholds our Christian values when played in a secular environment.
- **Directs** musical groups in a way that uplifts the students and inspires them to develop and use their talents to bless others.
- **Challenges** students musically to improve their skills through thoughtful instruction, guidance, and individual practice.
- Pursues professional development and continuing education activities to ensure Fletcher
 Academy and its curriculum and programs stay relevant and current, shares ideas with other
 educational professionals.
- Exercises sound judgment in selecting musical pieces for the performing groups by taking into consideration the philosophy of Fletcher Academy's reasonably conservative approach in following the "Blueprint" for Adventist education.
- Collaborates with the other music teacher and with others to build relationships, maintaining
 community and personal connections to promote learning, growing, playing, and worshiping at
 Fletcher Academy harmoniously.
- **Observes** professional standards in accordance with biblically-sound ethics.
- **Safeguards** the physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual safety and well-being of students, including protecting the privacy of personal information (per FERPA standards).

- **Creates** a culture which draws students to embrace a love for worshiping God through music in ways that bring honor to Him instead of us.
- **Facilitates** the effective and timely resolution of conflicts.
- Assists with other projects and tasks as assigned (i.e. student supervision team, etc.)

What (Qualifications):

- A Bachelor's degree in music and/or significant experience in leading musical groups and giving private music lessons. A Master's degree (or enrolled/willing to earn) is preferred.
- Special Knowledge/Skills: Must possess a wide and deep knowledge of instrument instruction and exceptional classroom management skills.
- Strong communications, public relations, and interpersonal skills. Effectively communicates both verbally and written (required to be fluent in English; bi-lingual is a plus, but not required).
- A working knowledge of both desktop and mobile operating systems.
- Must have a sincerely expressed desire to serve Christ and be a practicing Seventh-day Adventist
 Christian who is upholding and demonstrating the values thereof, and have a willingness to be
 part of a dynamic, diverse team serving in a drug/alcohol/tobacco-free campus workplace
 environment.
